The International Facility Management Association's (IFMA's) Facility Condition Index (FCI). was used to assess the building. This is a standard facility management benchmark used to objectively assess the current and projected condition of a building. Building V scored 25.99% (Poor condition), approaching Critical (set at 30%). The building utilization rate for 2018-19 Term 2E was 65.83% for classrooms and 82.67% for laboratory spaces.
