The system will reduce untreated storm runoff from entering the Little River by capturing runoff on improved swales, catch basins with exfiltration trench system with baffles and a hydro dynamic separator as part of the treatment train. The system will eliminate standing water on existing septic systems which can pose health risks. The system will also improve flood protection for the area being served including commercial properties on west side of the system.
